






International air travel numbers are unevenly dispersed

Worldwide International Arrivals in Q1 2022, compared with same period in 2019














All regions recorded significant growth year-over-year

Worldwide International Arrivals in Q1 2022, compared with same period in 2021















When travel restrictions disappear, bookings go up



Issued tickets for air travel; compared with 2019
















Flights schedules stabilize in 2022



Scheduled capacity for worldwide international arrivals in 2019, 2020, 2021 and Jan – Oct 2022












Worldwide international tickets issued between Sep 2021 and March 2022, % of 2019 levels






















Travel recovery for some APAC destinations is well on its way






The rebound of intra-regional travel will be key for the recovery of APAC



On-the-Book International Arrivals into APAC in Q2 2022, as of 2 April 2022; vs 2019 levels














Leisure travel is still driving the recovery, but business travel is catching-up

Premium cabin classes are in demand




On-the-book international arrivals worldwide from April to June 2022, as of 1 April 2022; vs 2019

Take-Aways



Travel to APAC has been accelerating into recovery mode, with destinations gradually reopening.

Even though leisure travel is still leading the recovery, business travel is catching up.

Q2 2022 looks more promising for global international travel than Q1. For summer holiday travel, sun and sea destinations in the Caribbean and Latin America are the most booked countries.

There is a stronger reactivation among the affluent traveller profile.
